Logline: When a marine biology student falls for a deceased 1960s Beach movie starlet who's been resurrected as a Killer-Mermaid in a Voodoo ceremony gone wrong, he must face his fear of water (and women) and risk almost certain death to woo the Killer-Mermaid he loves.

Comp: Superbad meets Splash.



Marine biology student NICK BIGMAN comes from a long line of surfers; his father was a surfer, his grandfather ROD BIGMAN was a surf champion who appeared in 1960s beach movies like Beach Blanket Bingo.

Unfortunately, Nick suffers from aquaphobia, an anxiety disorder that plagues many people who suffer from this extreme fear of the water. Nick can't enter any body of water without immediately going into a panic attack. And not only is Nick afraid of the water, he is also afraid of *women*.



Nick and his surfer buddy Daryl have crushes on girls Cindy and Alex. But unfortunately, the girls are dating surfer Nazis Travis and Monk.



In the 1960s, film actress Karen Slater and her surfer boyfriend Rod Bigman were the surf movie stars of the era.

But in a jealous rage, Karen's Hollywood agent Don Bulasky murders both Karen and Rod.



In a voodoo ceremony gone wrong, Don Bulasky brings Karen back from the dead.



Every spring Don Blasky feeds the killer mermaid Karen twelve human victims, so that the monster can become human again.



When Nick realizes that his love Karen is back from the dead, he and Daryl must fight the Nazi surfers, steal their girlfriends Cindy and Alex and defeat evil agent Don Bulasky. And Nick must conquer his fear of water and rejection by women.
