The immortal goddess Venus is on a mission to save humanity from its obsession with sex over love.

So after two thousand years of enforced celibacy by her father Uranus, Venus and her cat Bastet come to Hollywood to be intimacy counselors to the stars.



For centuries Venus had been romantically involved with the nymphomaniac Helen of Troy.

Now Helen is furious that Venus has gone straight. So there is bad blood between the two women.



Our hero is Vitalis, a Hollywood cinematographer who has been dating the most beautiful actresses in Hollywood.

But he has two problems: His sexy girlfriends inexplicably keep dumping him. And he is still grieving, because his beloved cat Bastet died forty years ago.

Vitalis seeks relationship help from Venus. Vitalis is the only human that knows that Venus is immortal.

What Vitalis doesn't know is that his cheating, super star girlfriend is actually Venus's ex, Helen of Troy.

Then Venus seduces her patient Vitalis, proclaiming that she is his true love.



That night Venus and Vitalis attend the Academy awards, where he is a nominee for best cinematography.

On the red carpet they encounter the snarky Helen of Troy, accompanied by a Jewish Chippendales dancer who is moonlighting as a Cal Tech calculus professor and Tantric sex instructor.

After Vitalis wins his Oscar (which has been converted into a vibrating sex toy by the lab geeks at Cal Tech), Helen of Troy kidnaps everyone to be her sex slaves in the Masonic temple across the street from the Dolby Theater.

Vitalis's character is tested by nude bungee jumping, bait and switch blow jobs from Helen of Troy, Navy SEAL invasions and the reincarnation of his cat Bastet. And Venus must transcend her promiscuous, bad girl past doing reach arounds as a jockey in the centaur races.
